The completion of the Health Forms and Criminal Background Check and admission checklist items are not required for the waitlist but must be completed before a student is moved from the waitlist to full program acceptance.

- Chemistry: One semester of college Chemistry OR two semesters of high school Chemistry with grade of “C” or better
 - NWTC Course: 10-806-134: General Chemistry
- Biology: One semester of college Biology OR two semesters of high school Biology with grade of “C” or better
 - NWTC courses: 31806312: Anatomy Structure/Function OR 10806189: Basic Anatomy OR 10806177: General Anatomy & Physiology
- CNA: Completion of a DHS approved Nursing Assistant course with a ‘C’ or better (certification is not required)
- Biochemistry: Grade of ‘B’ or better *(if completed in the summer 2012 or prior, a ‘C’ or better is acceptable.)*

Curriculum Note:

* No final grade lower than a 'B' is acceptable in the nursing or natural science courses marked with an asterisk. A student must repeat the particular course with 'B' or better final grade to continue in or graduate from this program. If the course is sequential, the successful retake must occur before continuing the sequence.

Note: General A&P and Advanced A&P: Completed with a 'B' or better (If completed in the spring 2009 or prior, a 'C' or better is acceptable)

Note: Microbiology: Completed with a 'B' or better (If completed in the summer 2012 or prior, a 'C' or better is acceptable)

Note: Biochemistry: Completed with a 'B' or better (If completed in the summer 2012 or prior, a 'C' or better is acceptable.)

** Must complete 10-543-115, Advanced Clinical Practice, with a "B" or better prior to the start of 10-543-116, Clinical Transition

All courses highlighted in **blue** are general education courses and are offered in a variety of different formats. They could be online, blended, accelerated, correspondence or in person. These classes are suggested to be completed prior to program start. Most of these courses are also offered at all regional center locations or campuses.

All courses highlighted in **yellow** are either offered online or in person during the day. The majority of the theory courses are one day a week, with the exception of 2nd semester theory courses. These courses are two days a week (MW 8:30-11:20), because they are only offered in person in an accelerated format. They are also offered online the entire semester.

All courses highlighted in **purple** are clinical courses. Students are asked preference of day or evening, but it is not a guarantee that students will receive their preference. All clinical courses will be 6 hours, with the exception of Advanced Clinical & Transitions. Students typically need to set time aside the night before or morning of clinical to complete clinical paperwork.

1st Semester – Long Term Care Facility. Clinical will be the 2nd half of the semester and could be day or evening.

Thursday/Friday Clinical.

2nd Semester – OB, Community, and Med/Surg. Clinical runs the entire semester and could be day or evening.

Thursday/Friday Clinical.

3rd Semester – 7 weeks of med/surg, 4 weeks of psych & 4 weeks off. Clinical could be day or evening.

Tuesday/Wednesday Clinical.

4th Semester - Med/Surg Clinical. First 7 weeks of the semester all students go to Advanced Clinical (8 hour clinical, 2 days a week) and could be day or evening. Thursday/Friday Clinical.

Clinical Times:

Clinical in hospitals are usually 6:45-12:45pm for days and 3-9PM for evenings. Long term care clinical is 5:45 -11:45am or 6AM-12pm. Evening clinical in the nursing home is 2-8pm.

All courses highlighted in **green** are your Skills courses. These are only available in person.

1st semester – Offered at a various times

3rd semester – Offered at a various times

Keep in mind for Skills classes, students will need to set aside time to practice and check-off on their skill with an instructor in the lab.

This clinical is a bit different from the rest, as it is a 90 hour clinical. Students work the hours the Nurse Preceptor works and may finish the clinical at different times.
