

Authorizing a Medical Reduced Course Load for F-1 International Students: <u>Basic Information for Medical Professionals</u>

- Federal Immigration Regulations (8 CFR 214.2(f)(6)(i)(B)) state that F-1 undergraduate students
 must complete a full course load of 12 credits per semester to maintain their legal status in the
 United States.
- Exceptions to the full-course of study requirement include a "student's temporary illness or medical condition for a period of time not to exceed an aggregate of 12 months while the student is pursuing a course of study at a particular program level." (8 CFR 214.2(f)(6)(iii)(B))
- The above-mentioned "Medical Reduced Course Load" requires documentation from a licensed medical doctor, doctor of osteopathy, or licensed clinical psychologist to the Designated School Official (DSO) to substantiate the illness or medical condition.
- The documentation must be signed by the appropriate doctor on letterhead and specifies
 either part-time (less than 12 credits) or no enrollment for a given semester for the named
 student. After DSO review, this documentation will be kept confidential in NWTC's Disability
 Services Office.
- The NWTC International Programs Office believes keeping students connected to the College
 and its resources are valuable. Less than 3 credits would disqualify them from such services and
 detach them from the campus community.
